
The Light Inerrant



A Coward's Guide to Living is Bruce's first book of fiction. Several incidents in that book are grounded on actual events and while the characters are fictional, some are based on individuals he's known.

His book, *Arn? Narn*. was named the English magazine Fishing Book Reviews Book of the Month. He was also a featured author at the Southern Festival of Books and a two-time Killer Nashville Writers Conference panelist.
