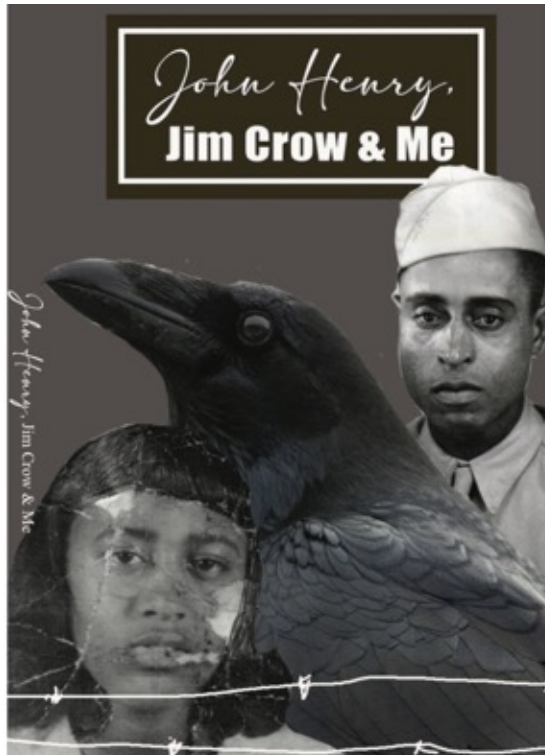


John Henry, Jim Crow, & Me
