
John Kovach has spent more than 35 years as a history professional as a museum director, curator and archivist.

On March 26, 1931, 18-year year old Virne Beatrice "Jackie" Mitchell of Chattanooga, Tennessee, signed a minor league contract with the hometown Lookouts. Mitchell took to the mound for a preseason game against the New York Yankees on April 2 and struck out both Babe Ruth and Lou Gehrig. With her exploits reported the next day in newspapers across the United States, Jackie Mitchell became a household name.

As a young girl, Jackie and her family lived in Memphis, Tennessee and news stories reported that she was taught to throw a baseball by Arthur Charles "Dazzy" Vance, a minor league pitcher with the Memphis Chicks.

In the 1930s, Mitchell played both baseball and basketball. In basketball, Mitchell played on Mildred "Babe" Didrikson's "All American's Basketball Team".

The book also has a unique chapter created from interviews with Jackie between 1931-33. Readers will hear Jackie in her own words tell what it was like to face Ruth and Gehrig and about her love of baseball.
