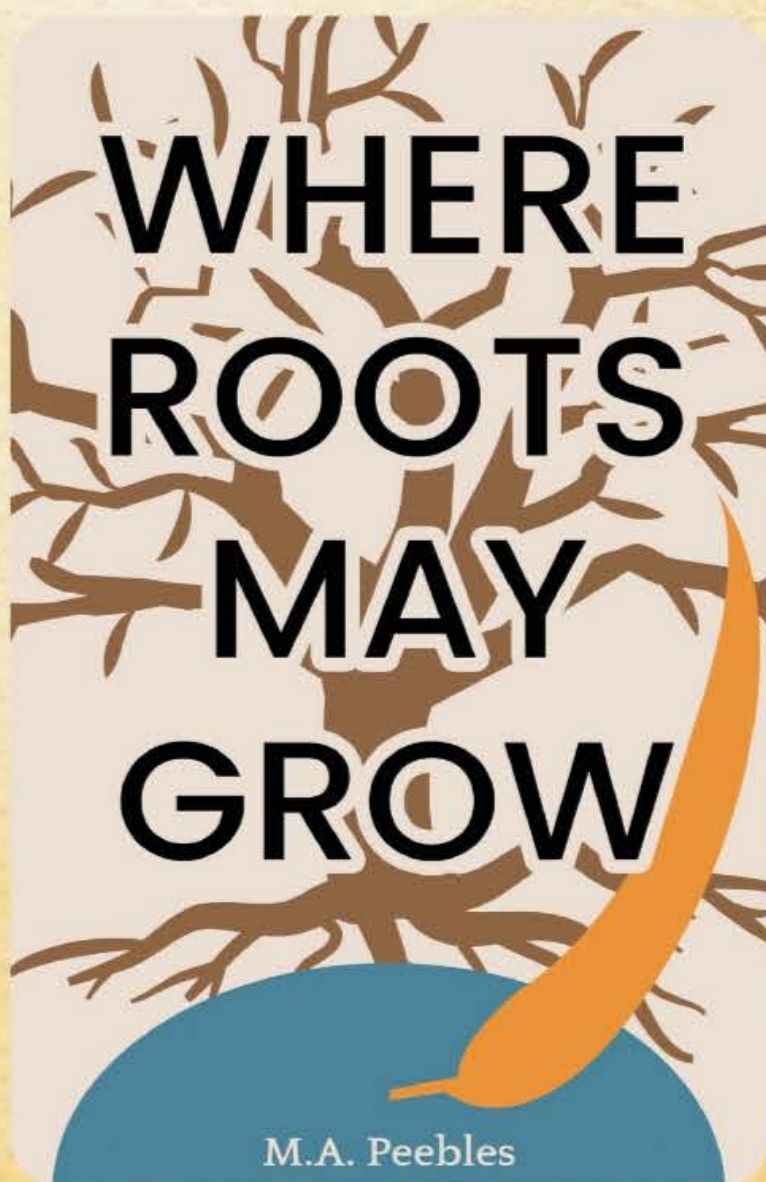


M.A. PEEBLES
